The Way of Love: Go

This Sunday after our service, you are welcome to join a discussion on the Way of Love spiritual practice "Go." This is our second Way of Love discussion this Lent. Presiding Bishop Curry explains the spiritual practice "Go" this way:

GO: Cross boundaries, listen deeply and live like Jesus

During the baptismal rite, we pray for the Candidates, "*Send them into the world in witness to your love.*" (*Book of Common Prayer, 306*). As Jesus went to the highways and byways, he sends us beyond our circles and comfort, to witness to the love, justice, and truth of God with our lips and with our lives. We go to listen with humility and to join God in healing a hurting world. We go to become Beloved Community, a people reconciled in love with God and one another.

We will discuss this spiritual practice by reflecting on the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) and a short reading from Leviticus (19: 1-18; 34). We may also bring this Sunday's Gospel into the conversation. Copies of the scripture readings will be available.

I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. - Ephesians 3:17-19

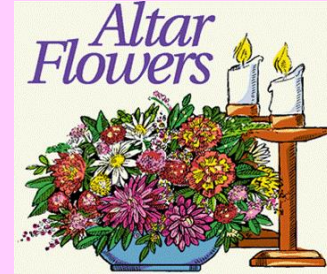
