Advent Wonder

Dear All Saints' Family,

When were you last greeted by wonder? Wonder: "that feeling of surprise mingled with admiration, caused by something beautiful, unexpected, unfamiliar, or inexplicable." We reflected on this question and others at Saturday's Advent Quiet Morning. We read the following passage from Luke's Gospel:

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you. But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be" (Luke 1:26-29).

Luke tells us that Mary was perplexed by the angel's words, "Greetings favored one, the Lord is with you." Mary pondered the meaning of this greeting. Surely, Mary did not understand the full meaning of what was happening at that moment. Did she feel wonder in the unexpected presence of God's messenger? Wonder at the astounding greeting and encounter with the Holy? Surely the angel's next words to Mary were even more perplexing—news that she was to bear a son, Jesus, who would be

called Son of God.

Mary was given a glimpse of the horizon. God's horizon. Only a glimpse. She waited in the midst of mystery and wonder.

As we continued to reflect on wonder, Barry and Becky played the carol "What Child is This?" (Callahan's *A Prelude on Greensleeves*). Here is the music recording from Saturday. Enter into Advent wonder, or be grasped by Advent wonder as you listen and ponder the question "What Child is This?"

Angel Tree 2020

In this time of COVID-19, we're not able to give Angel Tree gifts in the same way as years past. Still, we want to be as helpful as we can to families in need, so we are making adjustments.

We will be working with the several agencies we have worked with in the past to identify recipients for the Angel Tree gifts. Instead of responding to specific requests for families, this year we invite parishioners to drop off gifts for children, and gift cards for teens and adults. We will bring them to the agencies. As in previous years, gifts need to be wrapped and have a removable tag describing what is in the package.

Here are some guidelines:

What to get and how to label:

- If a toy or clothes: Label should name the toy or clothes, age range, and gender if appropriate (Ex: "Checkers game; age 5 and up"). This will allow agency workers to distribute appropriately.
- If a gift card: Label should name the store (We suggest Walmart, Target, or Price Rite) and the amount.

When to drop off at All Saints': Deadline is Thursday, December 17 by 2:00 p.m.

- Church is open Tuesdays and Fridays, 10:00 a.m. 2:00 p.m.
- After church service on Sundays

• If you would prefer to have an Outreach Committee member pick

the item(s) up from outside your home, contact Linda Johnson



Giving Opportunity in 2020

Our church building is beautiful and historic. From time to time we need to attend to some rather large repairs. We recently had an estimate for badly needed masonry work. The contractor identified an "Immediate Maintenance Attention Option" (see photo) for \$12,400. Now this is much better than the longer-term option (\$216,480), to be sure. However, even the smaller amount is a more than we have in our Capital Fund (\$3,523).

With this masonry work in mind, here is some tax information that applies only for 2020 giving that may be helpful; All Saints' is considered a public charity.

- For those who no longer itemize, the CARES Act allows individual taxpayers to deduct donations to charity of up to \$300 on their 2020 federal tax return, even though they take the standard deduction. Married-filing-jointly taxpayers will get an above-the-line deduction of up to \$600.
- The CARES Act temporarily removes the adjusted gross income (AGI) limitations on charitable deductions for cash gifts to public charities in 2020. Now, a donor may claim a charitable income tax deduction up to 100% of AGI for cash gifts, meaning you would pay no federal income tax. Previously, the donor would have had to

limit deductions to 60% of AGI. The 100% limit is reduced dollar-for-dollar by other itemized charitable deductions. This means that a donor who deducts 30% of AGI in long-term appreciated asset gifts (stocks, mutual funds, real estate) will be able to also deduct up to 70% of AGI for cash gifts, for a total deduction of up to 100% of AGI. Donors should consult their tax or financial advisor about these issues.

Regardless of the size of your donation, All Saints' accepts donations of cash or via credit card and check. In addition, we are able to accept donations of appreciated stock or mutual funds. For that option, please contact Becky Silliman for more information (**rsillima@bu.edu** or 401-946-3562).
