Wednesday Noonday Prayer and Faith Inquirers/Bible Study

Join us next Wednesday for Noonday Prayer and our weekly Faith Inquirers/Bible Study. We meet in Rose Hall. We are reading Leviticus Chapter 25 for Wednesday.

This week Deirdre Greelish offered a reflection on Levitcus. Thank you, Deirdre.

"When I heard that Faith Inquirers had chosen Leviticus as the subject of its Wednesday bible study, I groaned. It was a logical choice, because we had "inquired" about Genesis and Exodus our last two seasons, why not keep going with Leviticus, the third book of the Bible? Had I been there, I would have asked, "What can the book known for its endless list of rules (endless, literally; the rules continue in the next book Numbers!) tell us modern Christians? Can God teach me something about our relationship in Leviticus? I dared Him to try!

The first thing He did was remind me of the law libraries I had seen in my working years. One long wall would be stacked with books of state laws, the other walls had volumes about county and town laws. Did I have the same negative reaction to the law libraries there? Well, Leviticus was also a comprehensive guide to form a civil society. This revelation dissolved my prejudice against the Book of Leviticus by the time we got to Chapter 8.

Rev. Julie guided us through the various kinds of rituals and rules of conduct, the spiritual significance and symbolic meanings for the Isrealites in their day. I was reminded of the rituals of my childhood that are still with me at the age of 75: making my bed in the morning, brushing my teeth at night, and also the childhood commands "No pushing, no hitting," I didn't need when I matured

Leviticus comes full circle for me in Matthew 22:34, where a Pharisee asks Jesus "Which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus answer was to love God first, with your whole being, and He added a second command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself. All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two.'"
