Dear All Saints' Family,

Sunday's first reading is a passage from 2 Kings, a vision of Elijah being taken up to heaven as the young prophet Elisha watches. It is a vision of a chariot of fire and horses ascending with Elijah in a whirlwind. (If you would like an advance read, look up 2 Kings 1:17-2:14.)

Sometimes I include a photo on the Sunday program that is related to the scriptural passages. I always learn interesting things as I search for these images. My searches are rather open-ended. This week I was curious about

images of Elijah from the 2 Kings passage.

I came across a painting by William H. Johnson (1901-1970) called *Swing Low, Sweet Chariot*. The painting is based upon the spiritual of the same name, which in turn is based upon the 2 Kings passage.



As I looked around for more information on the meaning of the spiritual, I came across an article in which Dr. Arthur Jones was quoted. Dr. Jones described *Swing Low* as a signal song: "On one level it's about people hoping they can escape their misery by riding on this imaginary chariot to heaven, but another clear meaning is the idea that the chariot is a metaphor for escaping to freedom."

As it turns out I decided to focus on Transfiguration for the Service program cover photo. Nevertheless, I was very glad to discover the artist William Johnson, and especially appreciated Dr. Jones' words after meeting him during our Wisdom of the Spirituals weekend in October.

The Smithsonian American Art Museum has an exhibit this year of William Johnson's works called *Fighters for Freedom: William H. Johnson Picturing Justice.* Here is a link to more information on William H. Johnson and the collection of his art <u>at the SAAM.</u>
