In Memory of Eva Mozes Kor

Eva Mozes Kor died last Thursday, July 4th in Krakow, Poland. She was 85 years old. Most people will not recognize her name. As 10 year-olds, Eva and her twin sister Miriam were taken to Auschwitz where they were used for the brutal, Nazi genetics experiments led by Josef Mengele. The twin girls were Jewish natives of Romania who were deported to Auschwitz along with their family in 1944. Their mother, father, and two sisters died in Auschwitz. Eva and Miriam endured eight months of tortuous Nazi experiments before the Soviet army liberated the concentration camp in January, 1945.

It is hard to know what area of Eva Mozes Kor's life to talk about when trying to do justice to her deep courage and strength as a Holocaust survivor and advocate of forgiveness. After emigrating to Israel and then making her home in Terre Haute, Indiana with her husband, Mrs. Kor dedicated decades of her life to telling the world of Holocaust atrocities and the healing power of forgiveness. She never stopped remembering the horrors of Nazism while she spread her message of forgiveness to audiences around the globe. In 1984, Mrs. Kor founded the non-profit CANDLES Holocaust and Museum Education Center located in Terre Haute, Indiana. (CANDLES is an acronym for Children of Auschwitz Nazi Death Lab Experiments Survivors.) This non-profit did not escape anti-Semitic hatred. Arsonists destroyed the building in 2003; the Center was rebuilt two years later.

Eva Kor was criticized at times for her decision to forgive those who were responsible for the Nazi hatred and violence that she and her family endured. She, however, recognized that forgiving Nazi religious and racial hatred was not the same as forgetting. Mrs. Kor wrote of how she came to this realization. On the 50th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz she signed a forgiveness document while she stood near the ruins of Auschwitz gas chambers. She stood next to a German Nazi doctor who had been a camp doctor in Auschwitz from 1943-45. He signed a document about the operation of the gas chambers at Auschwitz. Mrs. Kor reflected, "I felt a burden of pain was

lifted from me. I was no longer in the grip of hate; I was finally free”

Each summer, Eva Kor brought young people on a tour of Auschwitz. She died on July 4th while on this annual remembrance trip.

Her son Alex Kor said in a phone interview with the Times of Israel, “My mom would be mad at me for crying. She would also tell other people not to cry to try and follow in her footsteps to try to make all wrongs right and make the world a better place. That’s her legacy. That’s her gift.”

Eva Mozes Kor gifted us, leading by example and showing us her courageous and extraordinary ability to remember and forgive Nazi religious and racial hatred and violence visited on her and her family. Remembering and forgiving - this is our common calling.

May she rest in peace.


