
The schedule of Holy Week and Easter services is below, as well as information about Easter altar flowers. A unique zoom link for the Maundy Thursday Service is included with this schedule.



I pass along the tribute given by Barbara Badio during the Service:

Henry Wadsworth Longfellow said:

Tell me not in mournful numbers

Life is but an empty dream!

For the soul is dead that slumbers

And things are not what they seem.

Robert Frost also said:

The woods are lovely, dark, and deep

But I have promises to keep

And miles to go before I sleep

And miles to go before I sleep.

What can I say about Dr Barry Turley? He was among the first few that welcomed me to All Saints. One Sunday after service as we were entering Rose Hall, I called out to him "Dr. Turley".

He turned around and said, "Am I getting an award?" "What did I win?" I said "Nothing!" I" I don't know what to call you, I just want to ask you a couple of questions about hymns". He then said," First of all, call me Barry, no formality."

Since then, our conversations were on topics ranging from hymns from Levas, the blue hymnal or Liberian songs and the beating of the sassa and the drums. He even wanted to invite a Liberian singer or a group of singers to church. No matter how long the discussions, our conversations always ended on food.

Barry loved Liberian food with just a' little dash of spice' as he always said. He was quite interested in check rice which he called green rice. He couldn't believe that the green color was not food coloring but spinach. Repeatedly, he'll ask, "so you're saying that the spinach turned the rice green"? When I replied "yes!" He said "Then you all are scientists"! Barry had an amazing sense of humor.

During one of the weekly evening prayer services held during the Ebola crises, he asked me to choose a song that I'd like to sing. Little did I know that it would be

sung in church on Sunday. He then told me that it had become one of his favorite songs. It reads:

There's a sweet, sweet spirit in this place.

And I know that it's the spirit of the Lord.

There are sweet expressions on each face,

And I know they feel the presence of the Lord.

Sweet Holy Spirit, sweet heavenly Dove

Stay bright here with us filling us with thy love

And for these blessings, we lift our hearts in praise

Without a doubt we'll know that we have been revived

When we shall leave this place.

Longfellow:

"Lives of great men all remind us

We can make our lives sublime

And departing, leave behind us

Footprint on the sands of time."


So, Barry, we never had the chance to make the "green rice". The 'scientists" and I will miss you, in fact we already do.
