

Music Notes



Several of our musical selections this morning (Prelude, and the Gradual and both Communion hymns) feature poetic texts by George Herbert. The font of all things known and unknown, Wikipedia, has this to say about him:

**George Herbert** (3 April 1593–1 March 1633) was an English poet, orator, and priest of the Church of England. His poetry is associated with the writings of the **m**etaphysical poets, and he is recognized as "one of the foremost British devotional lyricists." He was born in Wales into an artistic and wealthy family and largely raised in England. He received a good education that led to his admission to Trinity College, Cambridge in 1609. He went there with the intention of becoming a priest, but he became the University's Public Orator and attracted the attention of King James I. He sat in the Parliament of England in 1624 and briefly in 1625.


After the death of King James, Herbert renewed his interest in ordination. He gave up his secular ambitions in his mid-thirties and took holy orders in the Church of England, spending the rest of his life as the rector of the rural parish of Fugglestone St. Peter, just outside Salisbury. He was noted for unfailing care for his parishioners, bringing the sacraments to them when they were ill and providing food and clothing for those in need. Henry Vaughan called him "a most glorious saint and seer". He was never a healthy man and died of consumption at age 39.


