

Update from the “Healing of Creation” Garden

A rain garden is a round or oval depression that allows rainwater to

collect, be filtered, and nurture the earth. This, in turn, allows for clean water, rather than polluted water, to reach our rivers and Narragansett Bay. There are rain garden (called green infrastructure, or GI) projects all over

Ours will be designed to catch the large amounts of water that run off our roof into the side yard and beyond during rain storms. Construction will take place later this month.



Deep holes will be dug and lined with gravel before soil is added on top. They will be constructed to filter our run off water and will be filled with native plants that love shade and lots of moisture. The Churchyard Redesign team will be planting soon after the gardens are finished. Our side yard will be transformed from a flood plain to a lush garden and we will be contributing to the health of our rivers and bay.



Music Notes

Choir rehearsals are on Wednesday nights, 7:00-8:30pm in the choir room. New members are welcome and encouraged to join.

Sunday, the prelude, Sicilienne, will feature Becky Silliman on flute. Sicilienne, by Gabriel Fauré, was originally composed as an orchestral piece for a theatrical production that never came to be. Some years later it was arranged by Fauré and others for solo instruments, or solo instruments and piano, including flute and piano. The sicilienne is a musical style that is pastoral in character.


From Becky: I am blessed to own two wonderful handmade silver Haynes flutes, one that has been in my family for over 100 years (German model) and one (French model) that was my second most valuable purchase after I started my first real job as a physician-in-training over 40 years ago (the first being a new bicycle).

I have been asked how I decide which flute to use for a given piece. The simple answer is that it is the one that best fits the character of the piece. I

also have an African Blackwood head joint. Each of the three head joints has a slightly different shaped embouchure hole (what I blow across to make the sound - from more rectangular to more oval) which influences the tone quality, as does the inner diameter of the flute (the German model has a larger bore than the French). Theoretically, that means that I have six options (three head joints x two flute bodies), but in reality there are only five, as a larger diameter head joint doesn't fit into a smaller diameter flute body.

For the Sicilienne, I tried all five options and chose the German model flute with the wooden head joint, resulting in a sweet, full, and bright sound.
